# **Our Speakers**

## **Blois, Kody**

Born and raised in Kings–Hants, Kody grew up in a working-class household. The first member of his family to attend university, Kody completed degrees in commerce, law and public administration, which sparked his interest in serving his community. Before entering politics, Kody was heavily involved in the community through volunteering with non-profit organizations, coaching amateur sport, and working as a lawyer with McInnes Cooper. Since being elected in 2019, Kody has been a member of the House of Commons Standing Committee on Agriculture and Agri-Food and was elected committee chair by his peers after being re-elected in 2021. In his first term as Member of Parliament for Kings-Hants, Kody served as chair of the National Liberal Rural Caucus. Through these roles, Kody has met hundreds in the agriculture and agri-food sector, including farmers and producers from across the country, to better understand the issues and opportunities in the industry. Kody now serves as chair of the Liberal Atlantic Caucus, representing the region at the National Caucus table.

## **Brown, Ben**

Ben Brown is a para-canoe athlete who has been in the sport for over two years after making the switch from a 12-year career in para-athletics. Over 17 years ago Ben was training for an ATV motocross race where he unfortunately made a miscalculation while warming up which resulted in a spinal cord injury. During this time, he also maintained a successful market garden growing vegetables, small fruits, and cut flowers for a CSA and local market. She has an active applied research and extension program focused primarily on the development of integrated management approaches to manage fungal diseases of strawberry and to reduce losses to strawberry growers in Florida, but recommendations from her program extend across many regions, including strawberry nurseries in other states and worldwide. She has developed the widely adopted web-based Strawberry Advisory System, which provides recommendations for strawberry growers on the need for fungicide applications based on weather conditions and a rapid DNA test for diagnosis of strawberry diseases.

**Peill, Matthew**

Matthew Peill currently works at Perennia as its molecular biologist, primarily performing molecular testing for plant pathogens. Matthew has a Bachelor of Science in biology from St. Francis Xavier University (2016), and his Masters of Science in biology at Acadia University (2021). His master's work focused on strawberry aphids and their role as the primary vector of strawberry decline disease associated viruses. Previously, he was a horticulture specialist with Perennia and worked with small fruit and vegetables producers throughout Nova Scotia addressing production issues. Recently, he has been working on the provincial nematode survey after receiving nematode identification training in British Columbia.



**Plaskett, Talia**

Talia's role at Perennia provides support for protected crop production across the province. 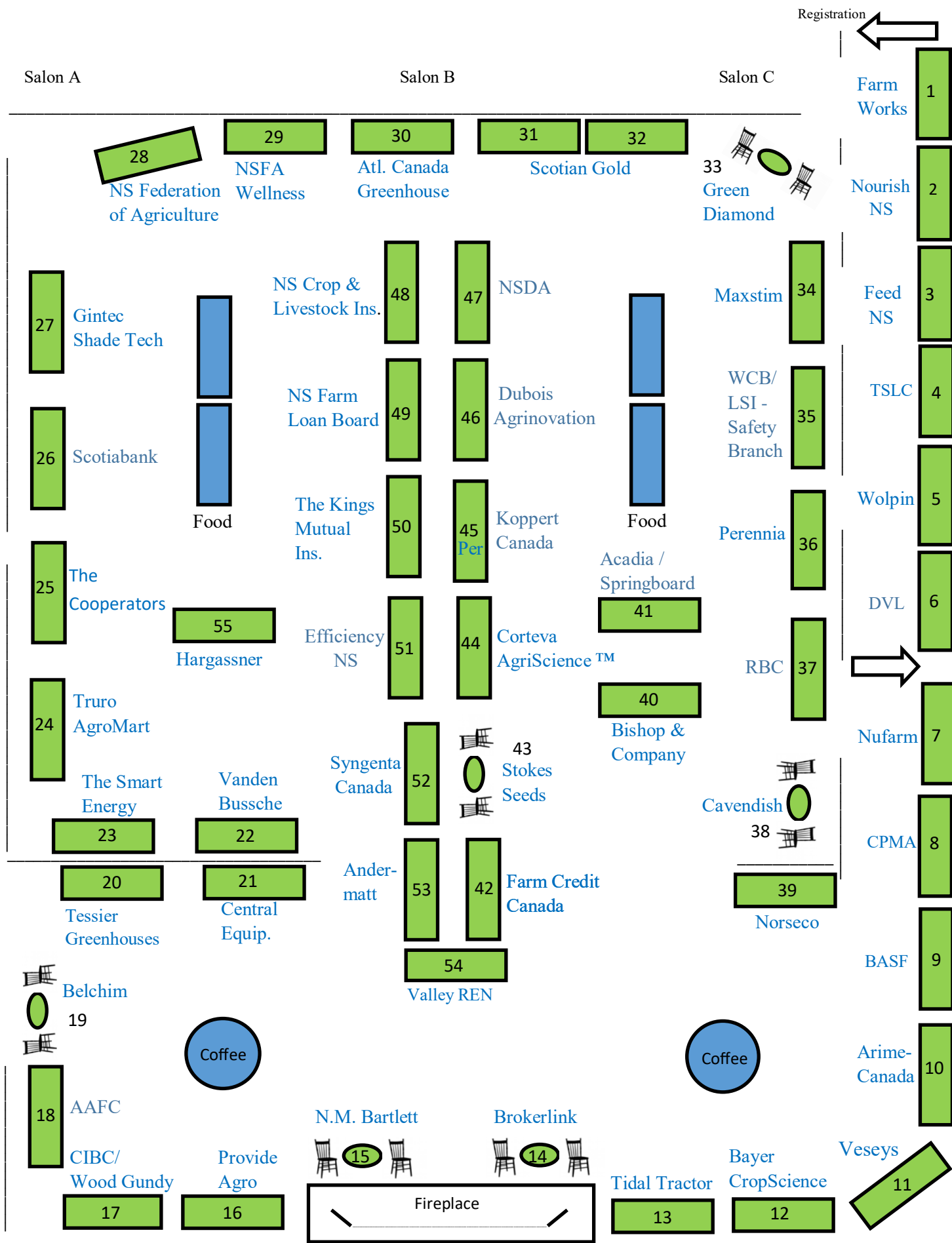
